- 4pm- students escorted to main office





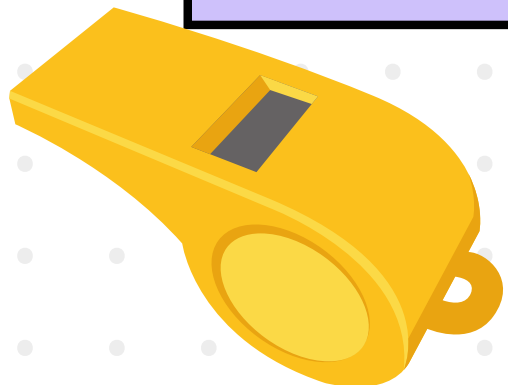

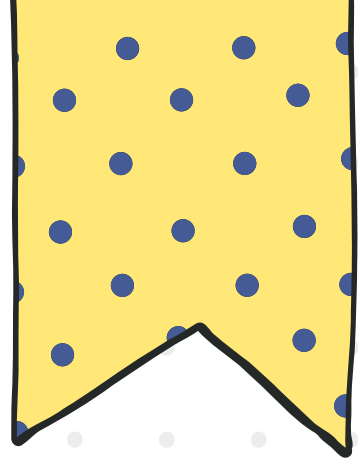
BILL- CS/HB 379



- THE FOLLOWING MOBILE DEVICE USE GUIDELINES WILL BE IN EFFECT STARTING THURSDAY, AUGUST 14, WHEN CLASSES RESUME IN ALL MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS:
- MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO USE OR CARRY THEIR MOBILE DEVICES DURING SCHOOL HOURS, UNLESS AN EXCEPTION IS MADE.
- STUDENTS SHALL NOT DISPLAY, USE OR ACTIVATE CELL PHONES OR HEAD PHONES DURING THE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY.
- THIS INCLUDES DURING:
 - CLASS
 - LIBRARY
 - TRANSITION FROM CLASS TO CLASS
- YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY.
- THE SCHOOL IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST CELL PHONES OR HEAD PHONES.

Discipline Procedures

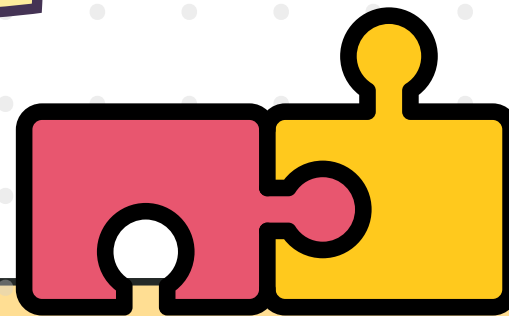
Daily Point Sheets

If my PSP agency allows, are PSP allowed to come into the property? According to FL Statute 1003.572- “requires Public Schools to permit PSP to observe students, collaborate...and provide services”



How can we begin the process?

They are provided with the application packet, and all required documentation. They (RBT and BCBA) will then be given a date to meet with the school team. Student behavior plan will be reviewed. Our PS will reach out to the teachers to see if there is a need. (Students will be observed by teachers for the first few weeks)



What will be their schedule?

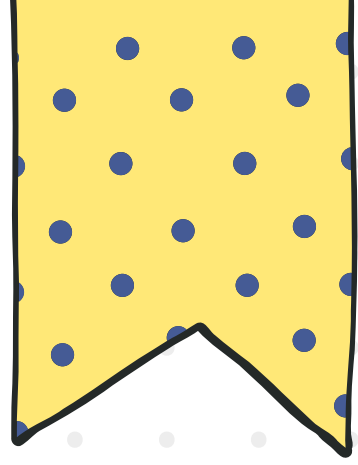

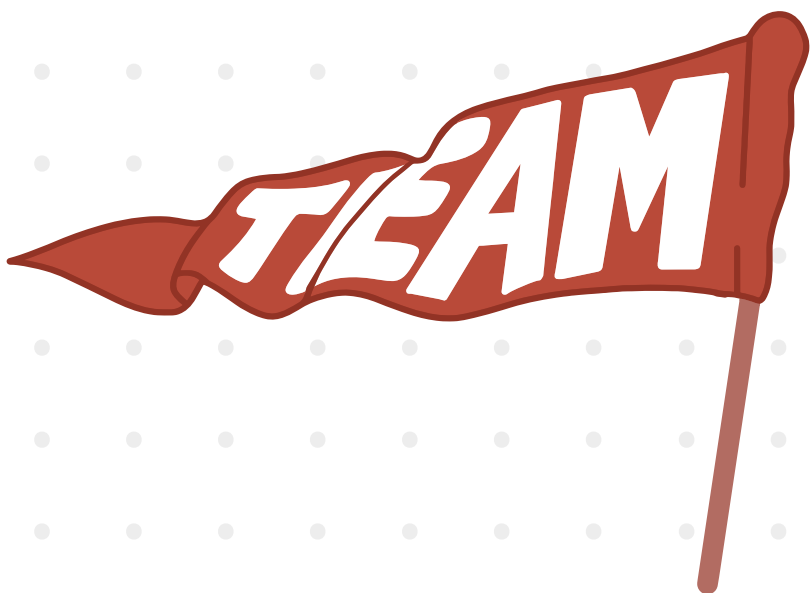


HIGHLY RECOMMENDED

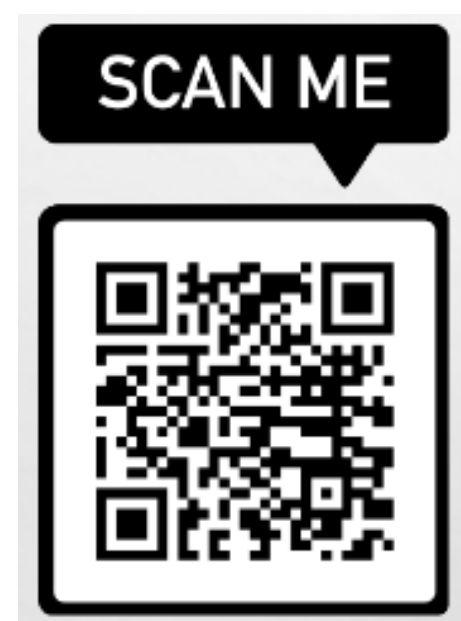
